

Brigadier General Steven J. Spano USAF, Retired Amazon Web Services

Brig. Gen. Steven J. Spano (ret.) is currently serving as the General Manager, Defense and National Security for Amazon Web Service's Global Public Sector. General Spano retired from the USAF in September 2011. He was formally the Director of Communications, Headquarters Air Combat Command, Langley Air Force Base, VA, responsible for IT vision, policy guidance, and resource allocation supporting the command's warfighting mission. Prior to that, General Spano served as the CJ6 for Multi-National Forces Iraq where he was responsible for all IT policy, interoperability and network operations supporting all joint and coalition forces. He also served as the principle advisor to the government of Iraq for Information and Communications Technology reconstruction. The general has commanded at the detachment, squadron and group levels. In addition, he served in key joint assignments at the National Security Agency, the Joint Staff, and U.S. Forces Korea. He was the CIO for United States Air Forces in Europe as well as Air Combat Command.
